Diploma of Hospitality Management

If you have your heart set on a career in management within the hospitality arena, this diploma course will help you take the first step up the management ladder.

This is a course that will give you a firm grounding in all aspects of hospitality, assisting you in entering the industry in a supervisory role. You will develop skills and knowledge in areas of food and beverage, front office and gaming. You will also study finance, accounting, administration, human resources, law and marketing in a hospitality context.

The opportunities for advancement are endless – you could find yourself managing staff in hospitality or tourism organisations around the world. Or gain enough experience and confidence to manage or own your own café, restaurant, bar, motel, hotel or business.

If you display the aptitude, there are opportunities to pursue further studies with HTA. The Advanced Diploma of Hospitality Management and the Swiss Higher Diploma in Hotel and Restaurant Management can open up advancement to the senior ranks within the industry, possibly in management roles for major international chains.

Or you can continue your education by articulating into one of nineteen universities across Australia.
